Ascension Day / Olympic Flame

The Chaplain writes:

On 8th May the Olympic Flame arrived in Marseille aboard the sailing ship Belem, where it was greeted by President Macron on the Vieux Port with fireworks, music and celebration. Before it arrived we took part in devising and leading an ecumenical service at the Eglise Saint-Ferréol, attended by around 150 people. The Bishop of Digne (whom we know through our work in the Manosque area) was there and it turned out that he is currently the Vatican's delegate to the Olympics, so he kindly pronounced the blessing at the end of the service.

Ascension Day on 9th May began with a small group of us taking part in the launch of the Olympic Torch Relay, as it began its journey across France from the Basilica of Notre-Dame de la Garde in Marseille. Later in the morning we held a service at All Saints followed by lunch, attended not only by members of our congregation but also other clergy from the Deanery - Jeremy Auld, the new Chaplain in Nice, and Chris Parkman, the Chaplain in Menton.
