Harvest Thanksgiving Services

We will be holding Harvest Thanksgiving services in each of our congregations during October:

6th October – All Saints' Marseille. The local food bank (the Banque Alimentaire des Bouchesdu-Rhône) have asked for donations of cooking oil, so please bring some bottles of oil to the service.

13th October – Oppède. There will be a collection of dry food goods (packets, tins, etc) for the local branch of Les Restos du Coeur.

20th October – Manosque. Again, there will be a collection of dry food goods (packets, tins, etc) for the local branch of Les Restos du Coeur.

27th October – Aix. There will be a cash collection for Les Restos du Coeur.

AMAM - Seamen's Club

In the port of Marseille, at the latest Plates & Medals ceremony on September 19th, the Seamen's Club was represented by two members of All Saints', Gillian and me. During the traditional speeches, I gave the captain a 2024 Olympic Games cap that we sell at the Seamen's Club together with a few vouchers for the crew. The ship was Mystic Cruises' World Voyager, built only in 2022 - fairly small by modern days standards: only 200 passengers with 130 crew. Because of its small draft it was able to moor close to the town, right next to the Mucem museum. The Ukrainian captain spent a long time with us, giving us the history of the cruise line (and part of his own career). Despite the company being very new, it seems that the economic model is quite successful, to the extent that the construction of a forth ship is now planned. Afterwards we were given a tour of the ship by the captain himself, including a visit to the bridge: just the same as on the bigger ships albeit everything on a smaller scale but just as modern, including all the necessary systems to navigate in Arctic and Antarctic waters. We finished the visit too early to be invited for lunch, so I took Gillian to one of my favourite eating places in town!

The EU's new Entry/Exit System (EES)

The British Embassy writes:

We have updated our <u>Living in France - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u> document with information on the new digital **Entry/Exit System (EES)** that the EU will introduce in Autumn 2024. Non-EU nationals, including UK nationals, visiting the EU will need to create a digital record when entering the EU's Schengen Zone. This includes providing biometric data (fingerprints and facial image) at the border. UK nationals with rights under the Withdrawal Agreement will be exempt from EES registration if they have the correct documentation.

Our Living in France guide gives important information and outlines what people need to know and what documents are accepted. In particular, those resident in France with children under 18 years old will need to apply for a DCEM card for the children to be exempt from EES registration. There is already a link to how to apply for this in the living in guide Passport and Travel section, just above the EES section.
